ANAGRAM'S BLACK COMEDY *FIDO* WINS TWO MAJOR AWARDS AT 2007 Gérardmer International Festival du Film Fantastique

Vancouver, B.C. – *FIDO*, Anagram Pictures dark comedy has won both the JURY PRIZE, for best feature film, and BEST ORIGINAL MUSIC SCORE at the prestigious Gérardmer Festival du Film Fantastique, the festival announced February 4, 2007.

FIDO was Directed by Andrew Currie, and co-written by Currie, Robert Chomiak, and Dennis Heaton. The original score was written by Don Macdonald (*Kissed, Mile Zero, Suspicious River*). *FIDO* was produced by Blake Corbet and Mary Anne Waterhouse through their company Anagram Pictures, and in association with Lionsgate.

Andrew Currie, one of four Anagram partners, was thrilled with the awards. "Winning the jury prize was fantastic, the audience and the critics both seemed to really embrace *FIDO*. And given the impact of music on the film, having Don win for best original score felt just great."

FIDO is being released theatrically in Canada by TVA films on March 16, 2007, and in the U.S. by Lionsgate on June 15, 2007.
